COVID 19 update

The most recent exercise involved an integrated and multi-agency response to a simulated maritime environmental emergency. The exercise involved the establishment of an exclusion zone, the deployment of a boom the use of a tug for spraying water.



Building Ongoing Relationships

Viva Energy continues to strengthen its relationship with our important customer, the Australian Defence Force (ADF).

In June, we had the pleasure of welcoming the HMAS Sirius back to Gore Bay where we loaded a combination cargo of diesel and marine fuel oil to enable her to depart for participation in naval exercises. It's great to be able to directly support not only such a key strategic customer, but also the committed men and women of the ADF whilst they proudly serve our country.

New Piles and Fenders

After receiving relevant approvals, we have almost completed a project to replace the existing wooden berthing piles and rubber fendering system at our second berth. This follows the 2019 completion of a project to replace the marine loading arms on the same wharf. The wooden piles were replaced with new steel piles equipped with a comprehensive corrosion protection system.

Berth two is a highly utilised berth being our main loading facility for our cruise ship customers (via our dedicated bunker barges), the Australian Defence Force (ADF) and Harbour City Ferries (via our dedicated dumb barge 'FBA2'). These enhancements to our key berth infrastructure will ensure that we continue



to safely and efficiently supply the harbour's commercial fuel requirements long into the future.
