Our Community Goal

We have established a range of community initiatives designed to engage, motivate and inspire our people. Each initiative is a vital piece of Viva Energy Australia's community program.

Our goal is to be a role model for our people, local communities and customers so they may strive towards positive social change with a similar level of commitment.

What is a Role Model Grant?

-

Once each year we will invite not-for-profit organisations to apply for grants up to \$5,000 in value.

Applications will be evaluated by our Role Model Grants Committee, which is comprised of Viva Energy people, and must meet specific criteria to be considered.

Projects must address one of three significant challenges:

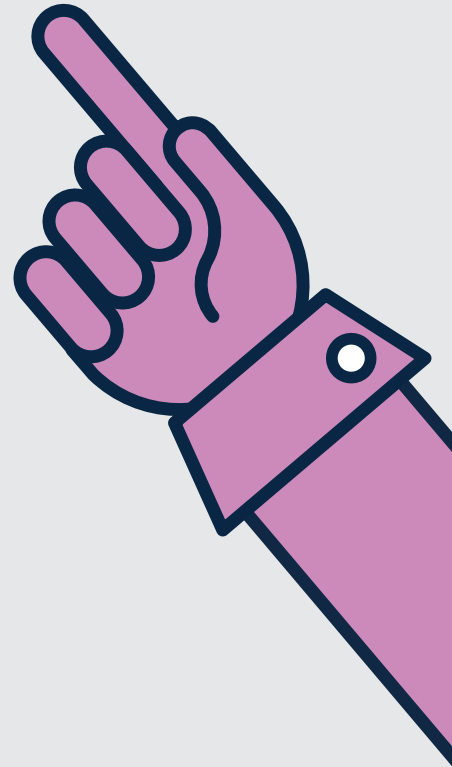
- Mental illness
- Substance Misuse
- Breaking the poverty cycle through education

The specific focus is on initiatives that will benefit the communities in which we operate.

What are the eligibility criteria?

-

- Organisations must be not for profit and registered with the ACNC www.acnc.gov.au or be a state education facility.
- Organisations are NOT required to be Deductible Gift Recipients (DGR 1)
- The proposed project must take place in or close to one of the following areas:
VIC Geelong or Newport
QLD Pinkenba (East Brisbane)
NSW Clyde / Gore Bay / Parramatta



How do you apply?

-

Simply complete the Role Model Grants Application Form in 800 words or fewer, plus up to 4 pages of additional material if you wish. Application forms can be downloaded from our website.

Advise Viva Energy if an elected official of any type (or an immediate family member of an elected official) is a director, manager, trustee or person with governance or financial responsibility within the applicant organisation.

-

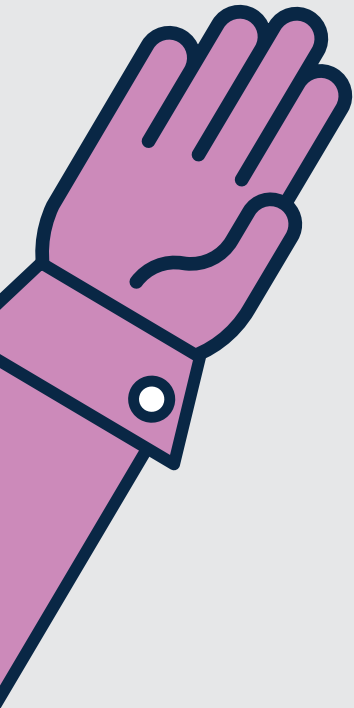
The Role Model Grants Committee receives a large number of worthy applications and unfortunately not every submission can be funded. Here are some useful tips to help you with your application.

- Think of some way to bring the application to life. For example; include a testimonial, photograph, letter of recommendation, etc.
- Be specific in the breakdown of costs and make sure the quotes are realistic.
- The community impact of your project will play a valuable role during assessment. The lasting change to beneficiaries delivered by the project must be clear.
- Provide some documentation (no more than four pages) that gives context or background to the project.

How are decisions made?

-

A committee of Viva Energy employees known as Community Ambassadors, representing our various sites, considers the applications and makes funding recommendations that are then approved by the Community Manager.
