Each year Viva Energy offers Community Support Grants of up to \$5,000 to help not-for-profit organisations implement programs that might improve the circumstances of people living within our local communities.

Objectives

Eligibility

All not-for-profit organisations that are registered with the ACNC are eligible and each application will be evaluated on merit, including those from organisations that have applied previously.

Organisations are NOT required to be Deductible Gift Recipients (DGR 1).



How to apply

Simply visit vivaenergy.com.au/community-grants and complete all sections of the Community Support Grants online application form before 14 October 2023.

The form asks for details that you may need to source, so we recommend that you familiarise yourself with the questions and prepare your answers before attempting to complete your application. Applications will be evaluated by our Community Ambassadors. These are Viva Energy employees who volunteer their time to drive our national Community Program.



Tips and advice

We receive a large number of worthy applications and unfortunately not every submission can be funded. Here are some useful tips to help you with your application.

- Think of how you might bring your application to life. For example by including a testimonial, photograph, or letter of recommendation.
- Be specific in the breakdown of costs and make sure the deliverables are realistic.
- The community impact of your project will play a valuable role during assessment. The lasting change to beneficiaries delivered by the project must be clear.
- Provide some documentation (no more than four pages) that gives context or background to the project.
